A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Early, Iowa was held on the 7th day of April 2015. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Sharon Ann Irwin called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with a roll call as follows: Present: Mary Ann Brinkman, Melissa Freese, and Brian Pickhinke. Absent: William Cougill and Vincent Davis. A motion was made by Councilor Brinkman and seconded by Councilor Freese to approve the consent agenda including; agenda, approval of tax abatement applications, minutes, and bills for payment. Ayes: Brinkman, Pickhinke, and Freese. Nays: None. Absent: Cougill and Davis.

City Council determined that City wide clean-up day will be May 13th. The City will not pick up any appliance, tires or demolished buildings.

## Early City Wide Clean Up Day May 13th, 2015

#### **CLEAN-UP DAY RULES:**

- Items must be sorted into three piles: (1) metal, (2) wood, and (3) general rubbish. Piles must be ten feet apart. (This makes it much easier to pick up.)
- Demolish debris will <u>not</u> be accepted.
- Items NOT accepted: tires, batteries, paint, hazardous chemicals, TVs., computer monitors.
- Appliances will not be picked up
- Items remaining after Clean-Up Day will be treated as a nuisance.
