# City Council News

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Early, Iowa was held on the 1st day of August, 2017. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Sharon Ann Irwin called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with a roll call as follows: Present: Doug Gulley, Brian Pickhinke, William Cougill and Melissa Freese. Absent: Mary Ann Brinkman. A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Freese to approve the consent agenda including; agenda, minutes, Casey's liquor license and bills for payment. Ayes: Freese, Cougill, Gulley, and Pickhinke. Nays: None. Absent: Brinkman. Motion carried

Librarian Delta Gulley gave a report on what has happened in the library since taking over as librarian in December of 2016. The City Council thanked Delta for all her hard work and encouraged her to keep it up.

A motion was made by Councilor Cougill and seconded by Councilor Gulley to approve building permit 737 with the condition the Supt. DPW marks where to put the concrete slab and the owner make a one call before beginning the project. Ayes: Pickhinke, Gulley, Cougill, and Freese. Nays: None. Absent: Brinkman. Motion carried.

Citizen input – David Larison telephoned during the meeting to discuss the nuisance abatement letter he received from the city regard "junk vehicles" and removing a sidewalk without the proper permit from the city, after some discuss the city council request that he get a permit to remove the sidewalk and due to the fact that the sidewalk lead to nowhere and it was a safety issue the city council will approve the permit allowing the remove of the side walk from 2nd and Maple St. to 2nd and Walnut St.

On a roll call vote: Ayes: Gulley, Pickhinke, Cougill, and Freese. Nays: None. Absent: Brinkman. 2nd reading passed. 3rd and final reading will be the next regular council meeting September 5th, 2017.
