A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Early, Iowa was held on the 3rd day of February 2015. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Sharon Ann Irwin called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with a roll call as follows: Present: Melissa Freese, Brian Pickhinke, and Vincent Davis. Absent: William Cougill and Mary Ann Brinkman.

Nick Schumacher presented the annual fire department report to the township trustees. 7:07 pm – Councilor Brinkman arrived.

Pennie Irwin presented a report on the Sac County Home Town Pride Steering Committee. A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Brinkman authorizing Mayor Sharon Ann Irwin to sign the Hometown Pride Partnership Agreement.

A motion was made by Councilor Davis and seconded by Councilor Brinkman to approve the consent agenda including; agenda,

minutes, and bills for payment. Ayes: Davis,

City Council discussed the FY16 budget. A motion was made by Councilor Davis and seconded by Councilor Freese to set a public hearing on the FY16 budget March 3rd, 2015 7:00 pm at City Hall.

Sac County Sheriff Ken McClure presented the monthly report to the City Council.

Supt. D.P.W., Mayor and City Clerk gave monthly reports.

A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Freese to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 8:50PM on voice vote.

Blind Date with a Book!





Several months ago I mentioned that Wireless Emergency Notification System (WENS) was coming to Sac County. This is also known at Alert Iowa. It is now operational for Sac County. If you have a landline phone, that is already in the system. It worked early last Saturday morning when the winter storm warning was issued. When you receive a message and you have caller ID it will come in as 712-555-5555. If you have a cell phone and/or a computer, you can sign up to receive these messages via any and all of these venues, too. If you do not have a computer with internet service and would like to get your cell phone signed up you can go to the Early Public Library and Cindy will help you get registered. To sign up enter the following: www.earlyia.com there is a link to sign up on the home page. It is a very simple process. If you wish to change some of your information later, you can go back and do that at any time. The hope is to have everyone in Sac County signed up to receive these emergency alerts.
