City Council News

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Early, Iowa was held on the 7th day of January 2014. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Sharon Ann Irwin called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with roll call as follows: Present: Melissa Freese, Brian Pickhinke, and Mary Ann Brinkman. Absent: William Cougill and Vince Davis. A motion was made by Councilor Brinkman and seconded by Councilor Pickhinke to approve the consent agenda including; approving new members of the fire department Casandra Crum, Regina Wolf and Sarah Krog, agenda, minutes, and bills for payment. Ayes: Pickhinke, Freese, and Brinkman. Nays: None. Absent: Cougill and Davis

Mike Bailey, Jenny Bailey and Crystal Cudaback representing the FOCUS Committee addressed the City Council requesting to hold and car show and burn out contest during the Early Crossroads Day. The City Council instructed the City Clerk to look in to the insurance liability and Mr. Bailey and Councilor Pickhinke will check on

other details of such a contest and will discuss it at the next regular Council meeting.

Councilor Davis arrived at 7:15 pm. Michael

Tuggle addressed the City Council regarding a letter he received from the City about a fence that he recently built on his property. The City Council instructed the Street Supt. to inspected the fence and insure that it is built on Mr. Tuggle's property line and does not encroach onto the adjacent property.

Resolution 14-01 Reappointment of City Attorney for Fiscal Years 2014 and 2015 offered by Councilor Davis and seconded by Councilor Brinkman. On roll call vote Ayes: Freese, Pickhinke, Davis and Brinkman. Nays: None. Absent: Cougill. Whereupon the Mayor declared said resolution duly adopted.

Resolution 14-02 Approving the Transfer of Funds from the Local Option Sales Tax Fund to the Economic Development Program Fund was offered by Councilor Davis and seconded by Councilor Pickhinke. On

roll call vote Ayes: Freese, Davis, Pickhinke and Brinkman. Nays: None. Absent: Cougill. Whereupon the Mayor declared said resolution duly adopted.

A motion was made by Councilor Freese and Seconded by Councilor Pickhinke approving Sackett Sceptic Service using the City Lagoon for dumping of sceptic waste at 50.00 per time. Ayes: Davis, Freese, Brinkman and Pickhinke. Nays: None. Absent: Cougill.

A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Brinkman to replace the door on the concession stand and the two restrooms located at the City Ball Field at an estimated cost of \$1838.00. Ayes: Brinkman, Davis, Freese, and Pickhinke. Nays: None. Absent: Cougill.

A motion was made by Councilor Davis and seconded by Councilor Pickhinke to reimburse Darwin Schmidt the cost of clothing that were ruined when a diesel hose broke in the amount of \$107.98. Ayes: Davis, Brinkman, Pickhinke, and Freese. Nays: None. Absent: Cougill.

A motion was made by Councilor Brinkman and seconded by Councilor Pickhinke approving Alarm Permit for 2014. Ayes: Brinkman, Freese, and Pickhinke. Nays: None. Abstain: Davis. Absent: Cougill.

Resolution 14-03 Setting the Salaries for Appointed Officers and Employees for the City of Early For The Year 2014 offered by Councilor Freese and seconded by Councilor Davis on roll call vote Ayes: Brinkman, Freese, Pickhinke and Davis. Nays: None. Absent: Cougill. Whereupon the Mayor declared said resolution duly adopted. A copy of said resolution is attached hereto and by the reference made a part thereof.

A motion was made by Councilor Brinkman and seconded by Councilor Pickhinke approving Payment No. 1 to Schmitt Construction in the amount of \$25,005.50 for the Derelict Building project located at 102 South Main. Ayes: Brinkman, Davis, Pickhinke and Freese. Nays: None. Absent: Cougill.

The Mayor, Supt. D.P.W. and City Clerk/Treasurer gave monthly reports. Sac County Sheriff and Early Fire Departments written reports were reviewed.

A motion was made by Councilor Brinkman and seconded by Councilor Freese to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 8:40 PM on voice vote.
