A motion was made by Councilor Cougill and seconded by Councilor Brinkman to approve the consent agenda including; agenda, minutes, and bills for payment. Ayes: Freese, Brinkman, Gulley, Cougill and Pickhinke. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Fire Chief Cougill gave annual fire department report and City Council reviewed FY19 budget with the Township Trustees.
