A motion was made by Councilor Cougill and seconded by Councilor Pickhinke to approve the consent agenda including; agenda, minutes, and bills for payment. Ayes: Cougill, Freese, Pickhinke. Nays: None. Absent: Gulley and Brinkman. Motion carried. A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Cougill approving Sewer Outfall payment request No. 3 for \$3,684.80. On a roll call vote: Ayes: Freese, Cougill, and Pickhinke. Nays: None. Absent: Gulley and Brinkman. Motion carried. A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Freese approving the participation in Sac County Housing Needs Assessment. Ayes: Freese, Pickhinke and Cougill. Nays: None. Absent: Gulley and Brinkman. Motion carried.

Resolution 18-16 – Adopting Home Rule Proclamation was offered by Councilor Freese and seconded by Councilor Pickhinke. Ayes: Freese, Pickhinke and Cougill. Nays: None. Absent: Gulley and Brinkman. Whereupon the Mayor declared said resolution duly adopted. Resolution 18-17 – Adoption of Revisions in Employee Handbook was offered by Councilor Cougill and seconded by Councilor Pickhinke. On a roll call vote: Ayes: Cougill, Freese and Pickhinke. Nays: None. Absent: Gulley and Brinkman. Whereupon the Mayor declared said resolution duly adopted.
