A Public Hearing was held at 7:00 PM in the council chambers at which time any citizen of Early, Iowa or any other person having interest in the proposed FY 2022 Budget for the fiscal 2021-2022 year as published in the Chronicle on Feb 11th, 2021 may appear and be heard for or against the adoption of the proposed FY 2022 Budget or any part thereof. No residents or taxpayers were for or against said Budget. A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Cougill to close the hearing. On a show of hands: Ayes: Pickhinke, Cougill, Mason, Schmitt, Langner. Hearing was closed. A Public Hearing was held at 7:05 PM in the council chambers at which time any citizen of Early, Iowa or any other person having interest in the Notice to Bidders for the Early Watermain Project as published in the Chronicle on Feb 4<sup>th</sup>, 2021 may appear and be heard for or against the adoption of the Notice to Bidders for the Early Watermain Project or any part thereof. No residents or taxpayers were for or against said Project. A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Cougill to close the hearing. On a show of hands: Ayes: Pickhinke, Cougill, Mason, Schmitt, Langner. Hearing was closed. A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Early, Iowa was held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March 2021. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Sharon Ann Irwin called the meeting to order at 7:10 PM with roll call as follows: Present: Brian Pickhinke, Summer Schmitt, Tim Langner, Bill Cougill, Steven Mason. A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Schmitt to approve the consent agenda including agenda, minutes bills for payment. On show of hands: Ayes: Pickhinke, Cougill, Mason, Langner, Schmitt. Motion passed. No citizen input. A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Cougill to approve building permit #775 pending approval of the Planning and Zoning Committee. On a show of hands: Ayes: Pickhinke, Cougill, Mason, Schmitt, Langner. Motion passed. Nuisance Abatement List was presented to the council, Citizens on this list will be sent a letter having 30 days to remove said nuisances from their properties or will be given a municipal infraction. Some exceptions were given to those with disrepair homes until the end of July 2021. Resolution 21-05 Approving The Budget for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 was offered by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Mason. On a roll call vote. Ayes: Pickhinke, Cougill, Mason, Langner, Schmitt. Whereupon the mayor declared said resolution duly adopted. Resolution 21-06 Approving Transfer of Funds From the Equipment Replacement Fund to the General Fund For the Purpose of Purchasing A 1979 International S1800 truck was offered by Councilor Cougill and seconded by Councilor Schmitt. On a roll call vote. Ayes: Pickhinke, Cougill, Mason, Langner, Schmitt. Whereupon the mayor declared said resolution duly adopted. Resolution 21-07 Approving Making Award of Contract For The 2nd Street Watermain Improvements was offered by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Schmitt. On a roll call vote. Ayes: Pickhinke, Cougill, Mason, Langner, Schmitt. Whereupon the mayor declared said resolution duly adopted. Ordinance 325 An Ordinance of the City of Early Entitled "RAGBRI-MISCELLANEOUS PERMITS was discussed for charge fees and will be added to next month agenda for First Reading. Council had a discussion on Sac County Communications Upgrades where the City of Early would potentially replace radios for the Fire and Recuse. They discussed estimated costs. Monthly reports were given by the Mayor, Library, and DPW. A motion to adjourn was made by Councilor Schmitt and seconded by Councilor Mason. Meeting was adjourned at 8:31 PM.
