# City Council News

A Public Hearing was held at 7:00 PM in the council chambers at which time any citizen of Early, Iowa or any other person having interest in the proposed budget amendment for the fiscal 2014-2015 as published in the Chronicle on April 23, 2015 may appear and be heard for or against the adoption of the proposed budget amendment or any part thereof. No residents or taxpayers were present either for or against said budget amendment. Hearing was closed.

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Early, Iowa was held on the 5th day of May 2015. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Sharon Ann Irwin called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. with a roll call as follows: Present: Mary Ann Brinkman, Melissa Freese, William Cougill, and Brian Pickhinke. Absent: Vincent Davis. A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Cougill to approve the consent agenda including; agenda, minutes, and bills for payment. Ayes: Brinkman, Pickhinke, Cougill, and Freese. Navs: None. Absent: Davis.

Early 4-H Achievers addressed the council asking permission to do two community projects; they would like to update the landscaping in front of the City Hall and paint the downstairs. A motion was made by Councilor Brinkman and seconded by Councilor Cougill approve the community projects and thanking the 4-H Achievers club for all their hard work to make Early a better community to live in. Ayes: Freese, Pickhinke, Cougill, and Brinkman. Nays: None. Absent: Davis.

Mayor Sharon Irwin announced that the Early 4-H Achievers have been selected for a Governor's Award for their service in the Early community. Ceremony will be June 19th at BV Uni-

A motion was made by Councilor Cougill and seconded by Councilor Brinkman approving building permits No. 714 with a setback of 12" from the sidewalk and building permit No. 715. Ayes: Freese, Brinkman, Cougill and Pickhinke. Nays: None. Absent: Davis.

Resolution 15-05 Adopting Fiscal year 2015 Budget amendment that was advertised in the Chronicle on April 23, 2015 offered by Councilor Cougill and Seconded by Councilor Freese. On roll call vote Ayes: Freese, Brinkman, Cougill and Pickhinke. Nays: None. Absent: Davis. Whereupon the Mayor declared said resolution duly adopted. A copy of said resolution is attached hereto and by the reference made a part thereof.

A motion was made by Councilor Brinkman and seconded by Councilor Freese approving the City of Early supporting the Home Base Iowa program. Ayes: Freese, Brinkman, Cougill and Pickhinke. Nays: None.

A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Freese instructing the City Clerk to contact engineering firm and request quotes on planning a street project. Ayes: Cougill, Freese, Pickhinke, and Brinkman. Nays: None. Absent: Davis.

Supt. D.P.W., Mayor, Sheriff and City Clerk gave monthly reports.

A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Cougill to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 9:03PM on voice vote.

### RECYCLING

Newspapers, Office paper, Magazines, Catalogs, and Boxboard to be recycled

Newspapers (including all inserts), phone books, junk mail, magazines, catalogs, office paper, envelopes (even envelopes with clear plastic inserts), clean paper sacks and boxboards containers (examples: cereal boxes, gift boxes, shoe boxes, cake mix boxes, etc.)

Remove all plastic liners and paper from boxboard containers and  $\underline{\text{flatten}}$   $\underline{\text{the boxes}}$ .

These can all can be mixed and should be bagged or bundled.

Do not place them loose in your recycling bin or mix with your glass, cans or plastic recycling.

Shredded paper can also be recycled but should be contained in a sealed sack of the pieces won't fall through the cracks.

DO NOT RECYCLE: wax paper, tissue paper, photos, carbon paper, paper towels, napkins, paper plates, and any soiled paper products.

These items are made into new newspapers, magazines, office paper, other grades of paper and insulation.
