City Council News

A Public Hearing was held at 7:00 PM in the council chambers at which time any citizen of Early, Iowa or any other person having interest in the proposed budget amendments for the fiscal 2016-2017 as published in the Chronicle on April 20, 2017. When residents and taxpayer may appear and be heard for or against the adoption of the proposed budget amendments or any part thereof. No residents or taxpayers were present either for or against said budget. Hearing was closed.

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Early, Iowa was held on the 2nd day of May, 2017. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Sharon Ann Irwin called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. with a roll call as follows: Present: Doug Gulley, William Cougill, Melissa Freese, Brian Pickhinke and Mary Ann Brinkman. A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Brinkman to approve the consent agenda including; agenda, minutes, approval of one day 7/22/2017 liquor license Tim Holmes location Sacred Heart Church pending approval from State of Iowa Alcoholic Beverages Division, and bills for payment. Ayes: Gulley, Cougill, Brinkman, Pickhinke, and Freese. Nays: None Motion carried.


