A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Cougill to approve the consent agenda including agenda, minutes, bills for payment, Casey's Cigarette and Tobacco Permit. ### MAYOR'S NOTES

As a follow-up to last month's article, the County Supervisors are going to have a public hearing on Tuesday, May 18<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 P.M. at Sacred Heart School Building. This hearing is to discuss and explain the new radio system for the county emergency services. Everyone in the county is welcome to attend. Resolution 21-11 was passed setting June 15<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 P.M. for public hearing on the matter of the adoption of proposed plans specs & form of contract for the water treatment plant. Sealed bids for said work will be received on June 8<sup>th</sup> until 2 P.M. Council also approved the Construction Service Agreement with Bolton & Menk for the 2ns Street Water Main project. The County Drainage District engineer has inspected DD59 tile and had reported these findings to the Council and asked for their consideration of their recommendations before presenting improvement plans to the County Supervisors. After some doubts, RAGBRAI will be passing through Early on Sunday, July 25<sup>th</sup>. Many volunteers are going to be needed to help with this big day. Garage Sale day will be on Saturday, May 22<sup>nd</sup> and clean-up day will be on Wednesday, May 26<sup>th</sup>. Let's all spruce up and clean up our whole community to make a great impression when RAGBRAI comes through Early.
