CITY OF EARLY City Council News

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Early, Iowa was held on the 1st day of September, 2020. Mayor Sharon Ann Irwin called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM with roll call as follows: Present: Brian Pickhinke, Bill Cougill, Steve Mason, Summer Schmitt, Tim Langner. A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Cougill to approve the consent agenda including agenda and bills for payment. On roll call vote: Ayes: Schmitt, Mason, Pickhinke, Langner, Cougill. Nays: none. A presentation was given by Silversmith Date Asset Management on a software program that could be used for more accurate records on city utilities and equipment. Consideration will be given to this at next month's meeting. A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Cougill to approve the building permit #769 for Terry Bruns. Approval by the Planning and Zoning Board has been given. Ayes: Mason, Schmitt, Cougill, Pickhinke, Langner. Nays. None. An individual had expressed interest in the custodian position for the Municipal Building, fire station and shelter house. Councilor Cougill will speak with the individual. Since Tim Langner has been appointed to the city council, there is a vacancy on the Planning and Zoning Board. A motion was made by Council Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Mason to appoint Brandon Scadden to the Planning and Zoning. Ayes: Langner, Cougill, Mason, Schmitt, Pickhinke, Nays: None. A motion was made by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Schmitt to set a Public Hearing for the SRF loan for the construction of the water project for Friday, October 9, 2020 at 7 p.m. per SRF guidelines. Aves: Cougill, Mason, Langner, Schmitt, Pickhinke. Navs: none. Monthly reports were given by the Mayor, Fire Chief, Library and DPW.

A special meeting of the City Council of the City of Early, Iowa was held on the 10th day of September 2020. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Sharon Ann Irwin called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM with a roll call as follows: Present: Brian Pickhinke, Bill Cougill, Steven Mason, Summer Schmitt, Tim Langner. Resolution 20-14 Approval of Requesting Reimbursement from the Iowa COVID-19 Government Relief Fund was offered by Councilor Pickhinke and seconded by Councilor Cougill. On a show of hands. Ayes: Pickhinke, Cougill, Mason, Schmitt, Langner. Nays: None. Whereupon the mayor declared said resolution duly adopted. Council discussed pay rate for the Mayor as a clerical fill in while the main Clerk was on medical leave. Council decided to pay at twenty dollars and no change per hour (\$20.00/hr.). On a show of hands. Ayes: Pickhinke, Cougill, Mason, Schmitt, Langner. Nays: None. Meeting was adjourned at 6:58PM on voice vote.

MAYOR'S NOTES

Our City Clerk Lexi will be back in the office on September 8. I personally will be happy to have her back.

Tim Langner is filling the balance of Melissa Freese's term. That will be up January 1, 2022. Because Tim Langner was appointed to the City Council he can no longer serve on the Planning and Zoning Committee. The Council approved Brandon Scadden to serve on the P & Z Committee.

The City will hold a public hearing on the next phase of a State Revolving Loan (SRF) on Friday, October 9th at 7 p.m. The City is also applying for a Water Treatment Financial Assistance Program Grant (WTFAP) and a Capitalization Grant to possibly help with the financing of this big water project. The City is trying to find any grants that might be available to help cut the cost to our residents for the repayment of this project.

The Summer Recreation and the City have had the lights replaced at the ballfield. There half as many lights now. They aren't going to be utilized this year, but will be ready to go next spring.
