
City Council News

A Public Hearing was held at 7:00 PM in the council chambers at which time any citizen of Early, Iowa or any other person having interest in the proposed budget for the fiscal 2014-2015 as published in the Chronicle on February 20, 2014 may appear and be heard for or against the adoption of the proposed budget or any part thereof. No residents or taxpayers were present either for or against said budget. Hearing was closed.

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Early, Iowa was held on the 4th day of March 2014. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Sharon Ann Irwin called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. with roll call as follows: Present: Melissa Freese, Vince Davis, William Cougill, Brian Pickhinke and Mary Ann Brinkman. A motion was made by Councilor Cougill and seconded by Councilor Pickhinke to approve the consent agenda including; agenda, minutes, and bills for payment. Ayes: Pickhinke, Freese, Brinkman, Cougill and Davis. Nays: None.

Resolution 14-05 Adopting Fiscal year 2015 Budget that was advertised in the Chronicle on February 20, 2014 offered by Councilor Brinkman and Seconded by Councilor Pickhinke. On roll call vote Ayes: Cougill, Davis, Freese, Brinkman, and Pickhinke. Nays: None. Whereupon the Mayor declared said resolution duly adopted.

MAYOR'S NOTES

The City of Early has been very fortunate so far this cold, dry winter. We have had only two water main breaks and one residential break. Some cities have had numerous main breaks, almost daily. I think the fact that a number of older mains were replaced a few years ago when we put up the new water tower has helped that issue.

On a very serious note, there have been numerous reports of someone wandering around town later at night and also a number of reports of items missing from cars and/or garages. I can report first hand that someone attempted to break into our house late one night back the end of January. The person was scared off when my husband appeared in the room the thief was attempting to break into. If you see or hear anything or anyone in an area and time that it shouldn't be, PLEASE call 911 IMMEDI-ATELY. Law enforcement will get someone here to check things out. Many of these previous incidents have not been reported to the police and so they aren't even aware of what is going on. Also, I know we live in a small town and we are used to leaving our home for a short period of time or leaving our car (maybe with the keys left in it) and not locking it. Learn to make all your property secure. Don't leave your garage door up for someone walking by to see what you have in there. Please be safety conscious! Don't give whoever is doing this, easy access.
