# MAYOR'S NOTES

We had a rather short meeting this month. There was not a lot on the agenda.

Progress on Drainage District 59 is still at a standstill until the archeological study can be completed. It is hoped that bids for the project can be done in April.

The new water treatment plant completion is somewhere in the future of this year. Controls for the operation of the plant are the biggest holdup. This is nothing different than a lot of projects everywhere: trouble getting the necessary parts and supplies.

Several months ago you should have received a letter requesting information about the type of plumbing that you have in your house. This isn't something that the City has dreamt up, the EPA and Iowa DNR are requiring all cities to develop this historic information. If you haven't completed this information yet, please do so and submit it to the City Clerk's Office. If you no longer have that sheet, you can contact Lexi and get another copy to complete.

Although it is snowing (Again) as I write this, spring is coming. My daffodils in front of the house are already about 2 inches above the ground. We will soon have to be doing yard work.

The new registration forms are available on our website or contact City Hall to grab a copy. Please make sure you bring an updated copy of your rabies vaccinations and a small picture. Penalty Licenses for fixed animals are \$20.00 per pet and \$30.00 for non fixed animals. If your pets vaccine are outdated and you are waiting until they get their renewal shots do NOT wait to get them registered with the City. You may always bring in their renewal paperwork. I prefer not to take anyone to court because you didn't register your pet(s). Thank you.
